## **Section Chief Address**

Greetings Grads! I hope you are all doing well and successfully navigating this challenging year. I would like to share some thoughts and observations on how Alpha lota and the fraternity in general are doing from my perspective.

If you were to visit the chapter today, I think you would find a group of undergrads that are functioning at a pretty high level. In spite of the pandemic, they are doing what they can to follow health guidelines, achieve in the classroom, maintain as much of a social presence as possible, and hopefully still having a little fun and enjoying brotherhood along the way.

The virus situation has been challenging to put it mildly. The university shut down after spring break and the brothers had to finish spring semester from home on the web. Orientation and rush/recruitment events system-wide were moved on-line. Pledging across the Greek system was way down. This fall the chapter has been open and vastly different. Masks required in common areas, dining in shifts to keep capacity down, monitoring guests, limited exits and entrances, and guys that tested positive were required to leave the chapter house for 2 weeks. The guys have been troopers, making the best of a difficult situation. I would like to thank the officers (now retired) for their efforts this past year. They certainly had some unique conditions to navigate: CP Carter Wadding, CT Cade Seegers, CRS Ryan Bissonnette, CCS Matthew Listwan and CH Austin Beck.

The chapter achieved a gpa average of 3.53 for last spring. Placing 17<sup>th</sup> among ~ 30 fraternities. The all-men's average was 3.63. They improved from an average of 3.01 for fall '19. There is a good mix of in-state & out-of-state members. The majority are business & engineering students. Total membership hovers around 100 the last few years. As I noted rush numbers are down. They are making a big push for this spring. If you have a young man to recommend. Please contact the rush chair before the middle of January. The university likes to scare guys into signing dorm contracts early and when that happens, they're locked into the residence halls for the next year.

Your grad volunteers have been affected by the pandemic as well. Paul Dudley, (PL) and Travis Dierickx (BCA) have had to adjust the way they interact with the chapter and are "pressing on" (Travis and his wife, Gray, are expecting their first child in early '21!!!). The association board has been especially busy, having to quickly shutter the house in March. They had to figure out how to open this fall, trying to balance health guidelines and still have a good fraternal experience. Nate Scott, the association president, Lou Filosa, the vice-president, and Bob Larrance, a local board member put in a lot of time and effort to make it work! THANK YOU!!!

The chapter house still looks really good. The renovation work coordinated by Wes Cole in the early 2000s has paid off in keeping the chapter strong. THANKS, WES!!! The brothers that donated time and treasure for those improvements deserve a big "THANK YOU" as well. We all know that guys are hard on facilities and probably in the next 10 to 15 years the property will need major work again. The board retained a firm to explore several options for the future. A relatively small remodel, a bigger project keeping the old section and replacing the addition,

and lastly an entirely new edifice. I personally like the middle option (I guess I have nostalgia for the old part). The board will keep you updated on what is decided. You can also contact Nate Scott directly for more information.

The fraternity in general is doing pretty good considering the environment. Most everything is virtual, no traveling field secretaries. Most chapters doing well, some having struggles. IHQ staff pulled off a virtual Ekklesia and is going to do the same for Academy in January. Brother Tom Waldon was re-elected to the Archonate (Congrats, Tom!). The Des Moines grad chapter had a fun gathering in the metro last February (30 plus attending). Then the pandemic hit, and events are on hold. The leaders (including our own Dustyn Curran) will get us back on track when conditions permit.

Section XXIV has been the chapters at Drake, Iowa and ISU for several years. This fall Nebraska was added back. It will be nice to have them back in the mix. This year, Eric Kvam is sponsoring a section competition. The main categories are rush, scholarship, and grad relations. A cash award provided by Eric will be given to the winning chapter in January. THANKS, ERIC!!!

The planning committee is still working on details for a Pig Dinner in April. We're hoping for the best but canceling and looking towards 2022 is a distinct possibility. We'll make the call either way early next year.

I've rambled long enough. I hope you all end 2020 on a positive note. I Am looking forward to a more "normal" 2021.


